The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) will incur about \$350 to \$400 in costs for producing and installing signs for this portion of highway. Specifically, the bill designates the portion of State Route 65 between State Route 64 and the western boundary of Wood County within Wood County as the Master Chief Special Warfare Operator (SEAL) Edward C. Byers, Jr. Medal of Honor Recipient Highway.

If a marker is to be located on a road outside of municipal boundaries, ODOT produces and installs the signs. Two markers are usually installed, one in each direction at each location. Once a set of signs is installed, there are typically no maintenance costs unless the signs are damaged. Signs usually need to be replaced every 12 to 15 years.
