### Highlights

- The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) will incur costs of approximately \$1,400 to produce and install each set of signs for each of the three designated memorial highways in the bill. Signs usually need to be replaced every 12 to 15 years.

### Detailed Analysis

The table below summarizes details about the memorial highways designated by the bill, including the location and the entity responsible for installing the signs. The cost of producing and installing signs is approximately \$1,400. Signs usually need to be replaced every 12 to 15 years. ODOT produces the signs and is often responsible for the installation. However, if the memorial highway is located within municipal boundaries, the municipality may install the signs and may need to reimburse ODOT for the production costs.
