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This table summarizes how the latest substitute version of the bill differs from the immediately preceding version. It addresses only the topics on which the two versions differ substantively. It does not list topics on which the two bills are substantively the same.

H.B. 333 (As Introduced)	Sub. H.B. 333 (I_135_1370-2)
Anonymous complaints	
Requires the Attorney General to establish a form for a police officer to use to anonymously report the use of quotas in violation of the bill's prohibitions.	Instead, allows a police officer to choose whether to submit the report anonymously or disclose their identity in the report.
Requires the Attorney General to investigate an anonymous report submitted through its website. (R.C. 109.70(D).)	Accordingly, requires the Attorney General to investigate all submitted reports, including those submitted by an unidentified complainant. (R.C. 109.70(D).)
