### State Fiscal Highlights

- The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) will incur costs of approximately \$350 to \$400 per sign, including materials and labor, to install appropriate markers along the designated section of State Route 93 in Lawrence County.

### Local Fiscal Highlights

- No direct fiscal effect on political subdivisions.

### Detailed Fiscal Analysis

The bill designates a portion of State Route 93, between mile marker 25 and mile marker 26, as the Sergeant Donald Long Memorial Highway. This stretch of road is located in an unincorporated portion of Lawrence County. When the General Assembly names a portion of a highway in honor of an individual, the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) typically installs two markers recognizing the designation, one in each direction, at a suitable spot along the highway. According to ODOT, the cost of installing such signs is approximately \$350 to \$400 per sign, including materials and labor. Once a set of signs is installed, there are typically no maintenance costs unless the signs are knocked down or damaged. Signs are usually in need of replacement every 12 to 15 years.
