<p><b>Distribution of funds to regional trauma organizations</b> (<i>R.C. 3728.09(A)(10)</i>)</p>	<p>Requires the Board to distribute to regional trauma organizations funds that are sufficient for the organizations to meet the minimum standards for Board recognition.</p>	<p>No provision.</p>
<p><b>Time critical diagnosis study</b></p>	<p>Requires the Time Critical Diagnosis Committee of the Board to prepare a report detailing its recommendations for a time critical diagnosis system of care and to submit the report to the Governor, the Board, and the General Assembly (<i>Section 5</i>).</p> <p>Requires the Committee to advise and assist the Board in matters related to the development of a time critical diagnosis system of care (<i>R.C. 3728.13</i>).</p>	<p>Instead, requires the Board to research best practices and other issues related to the development and implementation of a statewide time critical diagnosis system of care and permits the Board to periodically submit a report of its findings to the Governor, the General Assembly, or any other person (<i>R.C. 3728.09(A)(13) and 3728.13</i>).</p> <p>Instead, requires the Committee to advise and assist the Board in conducting its research into issues related to the development and implementation of a time critical diagnosis system of care (<i>R.C. 3728.13</i>).</p>
<p><b>Technical correction</b> (<i>R.C. 3728.02</i>)</p>	<p>Makes references to the American Board of Osteopathic Surgery and the American Osteopathic Board of Rehabilitation Medicine.</p>	<p>Corrects those references to the American Osteopathic Board of Surgery and the American Osteopathic Board of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation.</p>
