## CONTENT AND OPERATION

The bill designates the following highway and authorizes the Director of Transportation to erect suitable markers along the highway indicating its name:

Designated Name	Highway
"Congressman Louis Stokes Opportunity Corridor" <sup>1</sup>	The planned boulevard that will run in a northeasterly and southwesterly direction from the intersection of E. 55th Street and I.R. 490 to approximately the intersection of E. 150th Street and Chester Avenue within the municipal corporation of Cleveland
