(H. Armed Services, Veterans Affairs, and Public Safety)

Explanation and review of circumstances that cause a scholarship recipient to become ineligible and liable for repayments	No provision.	<p>Requires the Adjutant General to develop and provide a written explanation that informs all eligible scholarship recipients that the recipient may become ineligible and liable for scholarship repayment under certain circumstances.</p> <p>Requires the written explanation to be reviewed by the scholarship recipient before accepting the scholarship and before accepting an enlistment, warrant, commission, or appointment in the active component of the United States Armed Forces. <i>(R.C. 5919.34(c)(2).)</i></p>
Application of liability exemption to past scholarship recipients	No provision.	<p>Applies the liability exemption to scholarship recipients who were liable for repayment on or before September 30, 2016, for failing to complete their enlistment term in the Ohio</p>

		National Guard due to enlistment, warrant, commission, or appointment in the active or active reserve component of the United States Armed Forces (<i>Section 3</i>).
Repayment to recipients no longer liable under the bill	No provision.	Requires the state to return payments already made by scholarship recipients liable for repayment on or before September 30, 2016, for failing to complete their enlistment term in the Ohio National Guard due to enlistment, warrant, commission, or appointment in the active or active reserve component of the United States Armed Forces, not later than one year after the bill's effective date (<i>Section 3</i>).

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
