ACT SUMMARY

- Eliminates the ability of a member of the Ohio Legislative Service Commission to continue to serve on the Commission after the member's term of office in the General Assembly has expired.

CONTENT AND OPERATION

The act eliminates the ability of a member of the Ohio Legislative Service Commission to continue to serve on the Commission after the person's term of office in the General Assembly has expired, if the person's successor has not yet been appointed.¹

Under continuing law, the Legislative Service Commission is a nonpartisan agency whose staff provides drafting, research, budget, fiscal, and other services to the General Assembly. The Commission consists of the following 14 members:

- The President of the Senate;
- The Speaker of the House;

- Six members of the Senate, appointed by the President, not more than four of whom may be members of the same political party;
- Six members of the House, appointed by the Speaker, not more than four of whom may be members of the same political party.
