## Fiscal Note & Local Impact Statement

**Subject:** Designates the Army Specialist Danny Raymond King Memorial Highway

---

As a result of the bill, the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) will incur a minimal cost for producing and installing roadway memorial signs. Specifically, the bill designates a span of State Route 32 within Brown and Highland counties as the Army Specialist Danny Raymond King Memorial Highway. The stretch runs from the route's intersection with State Route 134 and the intersection with Corboy Road.

This memorial highway runs between intersections located in unincorporated areas within Brown and Highland counties. For memorial highways in unincorporated parts of the state, ODOT produces and installs the signage. According to ODOT, the cost of producing and installing a set of signs for memorial highways and bridges is approximately \$350 to \$400, including materials and labor. Two markers are usually installed, one in each direction at each location. Once a set of signs is installed, there are typically no maintenance costs unless the signs are damaged. Signs usually need to be replaced every 12 to 15 years.
