CONTENT AND OPERATION

The bill designates the following highway and authorizes the Director of Transportation to erect suitable markers along the highway indicating its name:

Designated Name	Highway
"Officer Bill Johnson Memorial Highway" ¹	The portion of State Route (SR) 73, running in an easterly and westerly direction, between the intersection of SR 73 and SR 741 and the intersection of SR 73 and Interstate Route 75, in Warren County.

Springboro Police Department Officer Bill Johnson was struck and killed by an intoxicated driver while serving in the line of duty on State Route 73 on June 27, 1983.
