This table summarizes how the latest substitute version of the bill differs from the immediately preceding version. It addresses only the topics on which the two versions differ substantively. It does not list topics on which the two bills are substantively the same.

Topic	Previous Version (As Passed by the Senate)	Sub. Version (L_132_0487-1)
Authority of highway patrol troopers to administer oaths	No provision.	Permits a state highway patrol trooper to administer oaths and acknowledge criminal and juvenile court complaints, summonses, affidavits, and returns of court orders in matters related to the trooper's official duties after completing a course of in-service training approved by the Director of Public Safety that includes training in the administration of oaths and the acknowledgement of documents (<i>R.C. 2935.081(C)</i>).
Intervention in lieu of conviction	No provision.	Rather than requiring a court to enter a finding of guilty and sentence an offender who has failed to comply with the terms and conditions of intervention in lieu of conviction (ILC), allows a court to continue the offender on ILC, continue the offender on ILC with additional terms,
