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## Fiscal Note & Local Impact Statement

**Bill:** H.B. 98 of the 132nd G.A.

**Status:** As Passed by the House

**Sponsor:** Reps. Duffey and Boggs

**Local Impact Statement Procedure Required:** No

**Subject:** Presentation of career information to students

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The bill may increase the administrative responsibilities of school districts. It has no direct fiscal effect on the state. In general, the bill prohibits school districts from imposing restrictions on the presentation of career information to students by representatives of skilled trades that are not uniformly imposed on representatives of business, industry, charitable institutions, institutions of higher education, armed forces, and other employers. Further, the bill requires school districts to provide two opportunities every school year for any of these employers to make their presentations in person to all high school students. However, this requirement can be satisfied by providing common area access for presentation of information materials or by providing a scheduled educational or career fair. The administrative responsibilities of school districts may increase to schedule such events if a district is not already in compliance with the bill's requirements. The bill does not require districts to provide any materials or staff for the presentations. Finally, the bill permits districts to develop an application process and standards of conduct for organizations that desire to participate in the career information presentations, increasing the administrative responsibilities for the districts that opt to do so.

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
