## Synopsis of Senate Committee Amendments\*

Replaced the provisions of the House-passed version of the bill (in R.C. 3113.311) that would have created a "dating violence civil protection order" to protect a person who has, or within the prior 12 months had, a dating relationship with the respondent from dating violence by the respondent, established procedures for issuance of such orders, and provided for registration and enforcement of such orders with provisions that (R.C. 3113.31):

- Expand the existing "domestic violence civil protection order" provisions to authorize a court to issue such an order (or approve a consent agreement) to protect a person with whom the respondent is, or within the prior 12 months was, in a dating relationship from domestic violence (expanded to include violence in a dating relationship) by the respondent.
- Make the existing procedures regarding the issuance of a domestic violence civil protection order and the registration and enforcement of such orders apply with respect to a domestic violence civil protection order in a dating relationship context under the bill, as described above.

In the provision of the House-passed version of the bill regarding the inclusion in the Attorney General's crime victims' bill of rights pamphlet of notice of a person's right to obtain a dating violence civil protection order under the bill, replaced references to such a protection order with references to a domestic violence civil protection order issued in a dating relationship context under the bill, as described above (R.C. 109.42).

In the provision of the House-passed version of the bill regarding the funding of shelters for victims of domestic violence and its expansion with respect to victims of dating violence, modified the language of the provision to conform to the language of the changes described above (R.C. 3113.33).
