Subject: Designates the Lt. Harry L. Martin Memorial Highway

The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) will incur about \$350 to \$400 in costs for producing and installing a set of memorial signs for this memorial highway. Specifically, the bill designates a stretch of U.S. Route 30 between where it intersects with State Route 231 and State Route 598 as the Lt. Harry L. Martin Memorial Highway. This stretch lies outside of municipalities in Wyandot County and Crawford County. If a memorial marker is to be located along a roadway outside of a municipality, ODOT produces and installs the signs. Two markers are usually installed, one in each direction at each location. Once a set of signs is installed, there are typically no maintenance costs unless the signs are damaged. Signs usually need to be replaced every 12 to 15 years.
