## Substitute Bill Comparative Synopsis

### Sub. H.B. 151

### 133<sup>rd</sup> General Assembly

This table summarizes how the latest substitute version of the bill differs from the immediately preceding version. It addresses only the topics on which the two versions differ substantively. It does not list topics on which the two bills are substantively the same.

Previous Version (I_133_0263-2)	Latest Version (I_133_0263-4)
<b>Animal chiropractic – scope and requirements</b>	
No provision.	Specifies that animal chiropractic does not include administering, selling, distributing, recommending or providing advice regarding (1) vitamins, minerals, and related substances, (2) over-the-counter drugs, and (3) durable and nondurable medical goods and devices. <sup>1</sup>

Previous Version (I_133_0263-2)	Latest Version (I_133_0263-4)
No provision.	Requires a chiropractor, before providing animal chiropractic, to require completion of an application for care form to disclose certain information to an animal's owner and obtain authorization for the provision of animal chiropractic. <sup>2</sup>
<b>Animal chiropractic – investigations and discipline</b>	
No provision.	Requires the State Chiropractic Board to retain as an expert witness a licensed veterinarian who is certified by an animal chiropractic credentialing organization if the Board conducts an investigation or takes action related to animal harm resulting from the practice of animal chiropractic. <sup>3</sup>
No provision.	Specifies that a chiropractor may be disciplined related to the practice of animal chiropractic in a manner similar to existing law related to the practice of chiropractic. <sup>4</sup>
<b>Animal chiropractic – rules and miscellaneous provisions</b>	
Authorizes the American Veterinary Chiropractic Association and the International Veterinary Chiropractic Association to certify animal chiropractic practitioners. <sup>5</sup>	Generally maintains that provision, but adds the College of Animal Chiropractors and any other credentialing organization specified by the State Chiropractic Board in rule; <sup>6</sup> also authorizes the Board to add or

Previous Version (I_133_0263-2)	Latest Version (I_133_0263-4)
No provision.	remove credentialing organizations, in consultation with the State Veterinary Medical Licensing Board. <sup>7</sup>  Permits the Board to adopt rules regarding animal chiropractic, but requires consultation with the State Veterinary Medical Licensing Board regarding any rules related to standards of medicine or care for an animal. <sup>8</sup>
