## Bill Analysis

### SUMMARY

- Creates the F-11 liquor permit, which authorizes specified organizations to purchase beer or wine from permitted beer or wine manufacturers and wholesalers and to sell the beer or wine at special functions held during the permit's 30-day validity.
- Prohibits the Division of Liquor Control from issuing more than three permits to the same applicant in any one-year period.
- Establishes a \$150 permit fee.

### DETAILED ANALYSIS

#### F-11 liquor permit

The bill creates the F-11 liquor permit, which authorizes specified organizations (see below) to do both of the following:

1. Purchase beer or wine from permitted beer or wine manufacturers and wholesalers; and
2. Sell the beer or wine at special functions held during the permit's 30-day validity period.

An organization includes an association or employer of ten or more persons, a labor union, or a charitable organization. A special function is a function that has a social, recreational, benevolent, charitable, fraternal, political, patriotic, or athletic purpose, but does not include any function the proceeds of which are for the profit or gain of any individual.

The bill prohibits the Division of Liquor Control from issuing more than three F-11 permits to the same applicant in any one-year period. Finally, it establishes a \$150 fee for issuance of the permit.<sup>1</sup>
