# **Synopsis of Senate Committee Amendments**

# H.B. 669 of the 133<sup>rd</sup> General Assembly

#### **Senate Agriculture & Natural Resources**

### To-go sales

Specifies that a qualified permit holder may only sell alcoholic beverages for to-go purposes as authorized under the bill if the permit holder also sells a meal with the alcoholic beverages.

Prohibits a qualified permit holder from selling more than three alcoholic beverages to any individual per meal.

### **Delivery of spirituous liquor**

Eliminates the bill's provisions that do both of the following:

- --Require the Division of Liquor Control to deliver spirituous liquor in original containers to liquor permit holders authorized to sell spirituous liquor by the individual drink and to personal consumers; and
- --Allow a micro-distillery to sell its spirituous liquor, via delivery, to a personal consumer, provided the micro-distillery enters into an agency contract with the Division.

## **Expansion of sales area**

Does both of the following regarding the expansion of sales areas for specified liquor permit holders:

- --Terminates the sales area expansion provisions on December 31, 2022, rather than creating a permanent authorization for sales area expansion as provided in the bill; and
- --Regarding the notice of an expanded sales area that is required to be given to the Division of Liquor Control and the Investigative Unit of the Department of Public Safety, requires the permit holder to provide the notice at least ten days prior to the commencement of the expansion, rather than one business day as provided in the bill.
