House Health

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This table summarizes how the latest substitute version of the bill differs from the immediately preceding version. It addresses only the topics on which the two versions differ substantively. It does not list topics on which the two bills are substantively the same.

Hospital visitation	
In the absence of a public health order to the contrary, requires hospitals to permit in-person visitation of patients in the following circumstances: (1) during a public health emergency related to the spread of a contagious disease or (2) at any time when a contagious disease is unusually prevalent (R.C. 3727.30(A)).	Similar, but removes the qualification that the visits are required in the absence of a public health order to the contrary (R.C. 3727.30(A)).
Requires that visits by the patient's family, caretakers, or clergy persons be permitted to the same extent as before the emergency was declared or the disease prevalence increased (R.C. 3727.30(A)).	Requires the hospital to <i>make reasonable efforts</i> to conduct visitation in conformity with its guidelines in effect before the emergency was declared or disease prevalence increased (R.C. 3727.30(A)).

Permits the patient, or a person authorized to make decisions on the patient's behalf, to designate visitors authorized to visit the patient, including immediate family members (which include the patient's parents, children, and siblings), attorneys in fact, personal representatives, caretakers, clergy, and other individuals providing care or companionship to the patient (R.C. 3727.30(D)).

Instead, specifies that the designated visitors may include the patient's family members (which includes persons related to the patient by consanguinity or affinity), caregivers, companions, and clergy persons (R.C. 3727.30(D)).

Precautionary measures

Permits a hospital to take certain precautionary measures during the emergency or increased prevalence of contagious disease, including:

 Requiring screening of visitors for symptoms of the disease before the visitor enters the hospital, in the same manner as for hospital staff and volunteers (R.C. 3727.30(C)(1)). Limiting the number of visitors seeing a patient at one time, but prohibits a hospital from limiting a patient to only one designated visitor (R.C. 3727.30(C)(6)). 	 Removes the requirement that the screening be in the same manner as for hospital staff and volunteers (R.C. 3727.30(C)(1)). Additionally specifies that a hospital cannot count a clergy person towards any limit on the number of visitors permitted to see a patient at one time, and must permit a clergy person to visit in addition to the permitted number of visitors (R.C. 3727.30(C)(6)).
Personal protective equipment – waiver	
In the event of a lack of personal protective equipment, permits a hospital to seek a waiver from the Department of Health if it requires visitors to wear personal protective equipment (R.C. 3727.30(C)(4)).	No provision.
Requires the Director of Health to approve or deny a waiver request (R.C. 3701.042).	No provision.
