# Previous Version (As Introduced, amended by am\_134\_2281-1 and am\_134\_2691) preneed cemetery merchandise and services contract stipulates a price other than a firm or fixed or guaranteed price; The seller's retail price of a casket, if the preneed cemetery merchandise and services contract stipulates a firm or fixed or guaranteed price, less any initial service fee charged (R.C. 1721.211(C)(1)). Initial service fee

Permits a seller of a preneed cemetery merchandise and services contract that stipulates a fixed or firm or guaranteed price to charge an initial service fee not to exceed 10% of the total contract amount (R.C. 1721.211(C)(4) and (D)).

### **Refunds - caskets**

If a purchaser cancels a contract involving the sale of a casket more than seven days after entering the contract, requires the seller to refund the following amounts:

- For a contract that does not stipulate a firm price, 100% of trust assets attributable to the casket less any fees charged and distributions paid by the trustee that are attributable to the casket;
- For a contract that does stipulate a firm price, all trust assets attributable to the casket less the following:
  - A cancellation fee that, together with the initial service fee, does not exceed 10% of the value of the trust assets attributable to the casket;
  - Any fees charged and distributions paid by the trustee that are attributable to the casket (R.C. 1721.211(G)(1)(a)).

Refunds – who may request No provision. Allows the purchaser, in addition to the beneficiary under current law, to request a refund (R.C. 1721.211(C)(1)). **Contract transfer** Allows a purchaser to transfer to a successor seller No provision. the funding for an irrevocable contract that involves the sale of a casket (R.C. 1721.211(I)(2)). Requires a purchaser to provide written notice to No provision. the trustee and the original seller of the transfer (R.C. 1721.211(I)(2)). Requires the trustee to transfer the trust assets No provision. attributable to the casket to the designated trustee of the successor seller within 15 days of the notice (R.C. 1721.211(I)(2)). Requires the original seller to relinquish and No provision. transfer all rights to the trust assets to the successor seller within 15 days of the notice (R.C. 1721.211(I)(2)).
