Highlights

The bill reappropriates approximately \$2.09 billion in capital funds for the FY 2023-FY 2024 biennium. This amount represents an estimate of available moneys on July 1, 2022. Generally, the actual reappropriations will be equal to the actual moneys available on July 1, 2022.

Detailed Analysis

Capital reappropriations for the FY 2023-FY 2024 biennium

The bill reappropriates approximately \$2.09 billion in capital funds for the FY 2023-FY 2024 biennium. This amount represents an estimate of available moneys on July 1, 2022. Generally, the actual reappropriations will be equal to the actual moneys available on July 1, 2022. These capital reappropriations are summarized in the two tables below. Table 1 presents the estimated amounts by fund. Table 2 presents the estimated amounts by fund and agency.

Priority for assistance for segmented school facilities projects

Under current law, a school district receiving conditional approval of state funding for a Facilities Construction Commission (FCC) facilities project has 13 months to gain voter approval of the bond issue and tax levy necessary to pay the local share of the project cost. If the school district does not gain voter approval in that timeframe, the conditional approval lapses. After a district's funding has lapsed, the district may still seek to receive voter approval. A district that wishes to renew a lapsed project must request that the FCC set a new scope and costs and may submit the updated project scope and costs to the district's voters, unless the district opts to resubmit the original ones. If the voters ultimately approve the local share of the project, the district receives first priority for FCC funding as it becomes available.

However, these provisions currently do not appear to apply to school districts that have opted to segment their facilities projects. Instead, according to FCC guidance, these school districts that have opted to segment their facilities assistance project and have not secured their local shares within 13 months remain on a segmented priority list, separate from a lapsed school district list.¹

The bill clarifies that school districts with lapsed segmented facilities projects are to be included with other lapsed projects in receiving first priority for funding. In other words, school districts with segmented projects may receive higher priority for state funding assistance upon securing their local shares after their initial state offers have lapsed in the same manner as school districts with nonsegmented projects. As a result, these school districts may receive their facilities funding offers sooner, potentially delaying the offer of funding for others.

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
