BILL SUMMARY

- Designates the full week beginning on the first Monday in May as "In-Demand Jobs Week," beginning in 2018.

CONTENT AND OPERATION

Beginning in 2018, the bill designates the full week beginning on the first Monday in May as "In-Demand Jobs Week." Every year during In-Demand Jobs Week, the Governor's Office of Workforce Transformation, in collaboration with the Departments of Job and Family Services, Education, and Higher Education, is required to organize activities to raise awareness among educators, students, and parents of jobs that are in demand by Ohio employers and the requirements and benefits of those jobs. The activities must include job fairs and company tours to connect middle and high school students with employers.¹
