BILL SUMMARY

- Designates January 30 as "Chronic Traumatic Encephalopathy Awareness Day" and names the act "Cody's Law."
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CONTENT AND OPERATION

Chronic Traumatic Encephalopathy Awareness Day

The bill designates the 30th day of January as "Chronic Traumatic Encephalopathy Awareness Day."¹ It also names the act "Cody's Law" or the "Chronic Traumatic Encephalopathy Awareness Day Act."²

Chronic traumatic encephalopathy, or CTE, is the term used to describe brain degeneration likely caused by repeated head traumas.³ CTE is a diagnosis that can only be made at autopsy, after examining sections of the brain. Researchers do not yet know the frequency of CTE or understand its causes. At present, there is no cure for the condition. Common symptoms include memory loss, confusion, impaired judgment, impulse control problems, aggression, depression, suicidality, parkinsonism, and progressive dementia.⁴
